The KL Experience

- 1.** Kuala Lumpur, the capital of Malaysia, has transformed itself into lively, busy city that's is home to more than 7 million people. Visit this city and you can discover wonderful hotels, Fantastic shopping, incredible food options and endless entertainment opportunities. KL is the destination that has so much; it is difficult to choose the best places. Because of its temperate climate, KL is a great destination at any time of the year.
- 2.** At more than 450 meters tall, the 88-story Petronas Twin Towers used to hold the world record for the tallest building in the world. It is a major tourist attraction, especially at night, when both towers are fully illuminated. A skybridge between the two towers is 170 meters above the street and gives a fantastic bird's eye view over the city.
- 3.** When you have had enough of the busy city, a trip to the Batu Caves is a must. Located in Selangor, about 20 minutes from KL city, the caves are the site of a Hindu temple and shrine that attracted thousands of visitors. On arrival, you will be greeted by monkeys hoping for peanuts! You will be immediately impressed by the large statue of Lord Murugan at the entrance. From here, you can climb 272 steps to see the immense cathedral caves with their 100-meter-high ceiling, and view the stunning KL skyline.
- 4.** KL has every shopping experience imaginable, from exciting street markets to luxury shopping centers. The main shopping district is Bukit Bintang, located in Golden Triangle area, which is just ten –minute drive from KL city center. Here, along the roads and streets, you'll find a mix of shops and bigger stores, as well as major shopping complexes, such as Pavilion Kuala Lumpur. Outside Bukit Bintang, You will find more great shopping malls, and if you are a bargain hunter, you should head for the Central Market in Chinatown.

If you are looking for authentic Malaysian food, make sure you try out some of KL's famous street food in Jalan Alor and Pudu Markets. Computers in the classroom
